Encouraging Independence

The children should enter the classroom unaided, bringing everything with them that they will need for the day:

The Literacy Curriculum

Reading

- Children must bring their book bags in every day.
- Ideally, three books a week, changed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday
- All children have a reading diary in which comments about reading are recorded – please read with your child and write in the reading diary regularly. We will also do the same

Writing


- Writing includes vocabulary, spelling, punctuation, grammar and handwriting.
- We will look at different genres e.g. story writing, poetry, non-fiction reports, posters.


The Phonics Screening Check

The Numeracy curriculum

Children will develop mathematical understanding of number, place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, measurement and geometry (position and direction, and properties of shape).

 Our aim is to help children to recognise the relevance of mathematics in the world around them and to develop a curiosity and excitement about making mathematical discoveries.

 Children learn to question, investigate and communicate their reasoning through the provision of real life inspired enrichment activities.

How you can help at home:

Literacy

- Please try to read x3 times a week

- Focus on developing their fluency and mastery of concepts through quick recall of number facts
- Show them maths in different contexts and the relationship between numbers
